BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TE-MOAK TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE TE-MOAK TRIBE OF WESTERN SHOSHONE INDIANS OF NEVADA, THAT:

WHEREAS, this organization is an Indian Organization known as defined under the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, as amended, to exercise rights of home rule and is responsible for the promotion of the economic and social welfare of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Indians of Nevada, is composed of four (4) constituent Bands, Elko, Battle Mountain, South fork and Wells; and

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe is responsible to protect and preserve the safety, welfare of our Tribal Members; and

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe supports Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board to enter into a P.L. 93-638 Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Law Enforcement Services; and

WHEREAS, the Elko Band Council, by Resolution NO: 2014-EBC-03 does support and recognize the Te-Moak Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board; and

WHEREAS, the Battle Mountain Band Council, by Resolution NO: 14-BM-07 does support and recognize the Te-Moak Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board; and

WHEREAS, the Wells Band Council, by Resolution NO: 2-WBC-2014 does support and recognize the Te-Moak Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board; and

WHEREAS, the above areas reserves the right to relinquish this support after one year, and request a 638 contract under the name of Elko Band Council if adequate services are not provided or if the system is not held to the desired standard; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Te-Moak Council hereby recognizing the three (3) Constituent Bands request to have the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board to continue a multi-year (3 year) contract beginning FY-15 to FY-18.

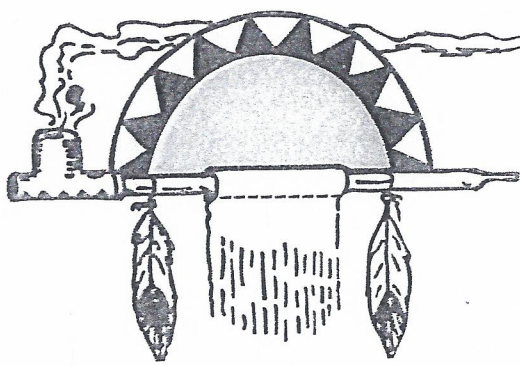

WHEREAS, the Elko Band Council has the obligation to protect and preserve the safety, welfare, and properties associated with the Elko Indian Colony members; and


WHEREAS, the Elko Band Council supports the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board to enter into a P.L. 93-638 Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Law Enforcement Services; and

WHEREAS, the Elko Band Council reserves the right to relinquish this support and request a 638 contract under the name of Elko Band Council if adequate services are not provided or if the system is not held to the desired standard; and



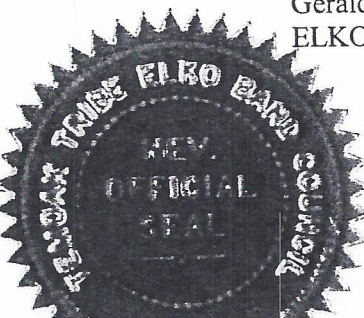

WHEREAS, Battle Mountain Band Council supports the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Law Enforcement Services Public Safety Board to enter into a P.L. 638 Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Law Enforcement Services, and


WHEREAS, the Battle Mountain Band Council reserves the right to relinquish this support after one year, and request a 638 Contract under the name of Battle Mountain Band Council if adequate services are not provided or if the person is not held to the desired standard, and

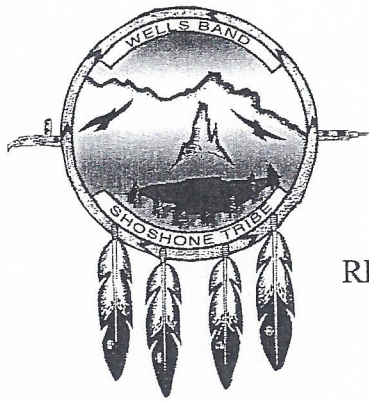

WHEREAS, the Wells Band Council reserves the right to relinquish this support after one year, and request a 638 contract under the name of Wells Band Council if adequate services are not provided or if the system is not held to the desired standard, and
